

# Norton Lindsey Parish Council Action Plan

## 2023-2024

Objective	Action points
1. Improve the safety and quality of roads and footpaths	<p>See through to completion the 20mph speed limit along Main Street</p> <p>Identify problem public footpaths and liaise with landowners, etc. to affect improvements.</p> <p>Encourage safe vehicular speeds across the whole parish and in particular at the entry/exit points of the 'village' – working with County and District Councils</p> <p>Encourage considerate car-parking – particularly not blocking the pavement / allowing access for school bus traffic etc.</p>
2. Take steps to improve the environment / address climate change	<p>Organise public meetings (in conjunction with neighbouring parishes) to provide information about local environmental initiatives and actions that individual households can take</p> <p>Continue and monitor success of “active” rewilding on Wolverton Road</p> <p>Liaise with Wolverton and Langley PCs to extend areas of rewilding / increased biodiversity</p> <p>Seek to work with landowners to establish new permitted footpaths where they would encourage walking and road safety</p>
3. Enhance communication with parishioners	<p>Use parishioner survey of future developments within NL to formalise and publish key points (“parish plan-lite”)</p> <p>Create and distribute as appropriate a “welcome pack” for new residents</p> <p>Create and distribute the biennial parish council update (Spring 2024)</p>
4. Protect Heritage Assets	<p>Continue to seek to ensure that assets such as the Victoria Signpost and Stanks Horsetrough are appropriately protected and maintained by the ‘appropriate’ bodies.</p>
